#### **Foundation Updates**

#### Give Local 2022

Thanks to local donors, we raised \$1,900 during our Give Local campaign. We'll use this money for park improvements and maintenance.



In early November, the east side of the Brewery Park trail near the Boston Street bridge experienced a rock slide.

This section is closed until the bank is stabilized. We will know more when we receive the geotechnical report.



We hosted a group of tourism professionals from the UK and Ireland on a trip around the state visiting places to promote when they go back home. They learned about the Deschutes River's importance to local history, our hatchery system, and how the water and salmon are deeply ingrained in our culture.

#### **Education Program**



In 2022, we gave \$140,000 in high school scholarships. Since the inception of our memorial scholarship program in 1967, we've donated over \$2.2 million to local high school seniors.

In November, we gave \$15,000 in early learning grants to 15 schools and organizations to go toward K-3 classroom projects.


#### **Geologic History of Thurston County**

Louis Schmidt, brother of Olympia Brewery founder Leopold, moved from Tumwater to Hope Island in 1905. His farm included a sizable house, barns, and a hop kiln (drying shed). Some of the family's fruit trees still exist—the entire island is now a state park.
